HIGH-RISK MEDICATIONS

My apologies for the absence of our April newsletter. I was unexpectedly hospitalized in March, diagnosed with bilateral, bacterial pneumonia and sepsis. The culprit? My blood pressure medication, a diuretic, which was depleting my body of essential minerals, like potassium, resulting in extreme fatigue I was incorrectly blaming on Long COVID.

Although my medication is not so designated, "*high-risk medications* are those identified by American Geriatrics Society (AGS) Beers Criteria (named after geriatrician, Dr. Mark Beers, who developed it in 1991) and by the Pharmacy Quality Alliance as having the potential to cause adverse drug events in older adults due to their pharmacologic properties and the physiologic changes of aging". MAY IS BETTER SPEECH & HEARING MONTH!

HELP YOURSELF & OTHERS – JOIN THE SPEECH ACCESSIBILITY PROJECT

Did you know that movement disorders can impact your speech - like the volume and rhythm of your voice, and the ability to be understood - as well as your chewing and swallowing? **The Speech Accessibility Project** is collecting speech samples from paid volunteers representing a diversity of speech patterns. Led by University of Illinois-Urbana-Champaign researchers with support from Amazon, Apple, Google, Meta, and Microsoft, the project aims to make voice recognition technology more useful for people with a range of diverse speech patterns and disabilities.

The project is seeking people with Parkinson's, as well as those with related neurological conditions like MSA, PSP, CBD, and those who are post-DBS. Those interested in participating will work with an LSVT Global mentor to learn more about the project and proceed through a brief screening process. Participants can complete the project using their own computers to read text promote aloud or answer.

project using their own computers to read text prompts aloud or answer questions while recording their voices.

The project includes 10 sets of about 45 prompts (about 60 sentences). These do not need to be completed at once. It may take participants a few days or a few weeks to complete their recordings. For more information, please see the flyer on page 6 or go to:



IN CELEBRATION OF A LIFE WELL-LIVED INDOMITABLE SPIRIT – LEILA JIMINEZ September 2, 1942 –November 8, 2023

Indomitable Spirit – "That part of a person which provides hope, strength, and courage to get up and face each day with a smile. Indomitable spirit is perseverance on a long-term basis."

Leila was born in Caracas Venezuela. She studied in Caracas and in Liege, Belgium, then traveled to New York by steamer, and on to Boston where she graduated from Boston University. There she met her first husband and had a daughter, Vanessa. After graduation she worked for Booz Allen, the International Monetary Fund (had a trans-Atlantic flight on the Concorde), Smart Systems Technology (AI) and Information Systems Laboratories. We have been together since 1981; she was diagnosed with Parkinson's in 1990.

Leila never complained and made the most of each day for 33 years after being diagnosed with Parkinson's at age 48. In fact, she was determined to live fully and fiercely, as she had during her first 5 decades. Two years later we accelerated timing of our dream, had a yard sale, and set sail around the world visiting varied cultures and remote beaches. Leila thrived making friends with other vachties and interacting with port authorities - being trilingual fluent helped. Magic nights at sea under the stars, shell collecting, exotic markets, exploring - sailing duties (3 hours shifts, helming, repairing) and some challenges - 50' waves, hurricane winds, and pirates. She did it all. After 6 years, sailing became too much. We relocated to San Diego to resume employment and exploring. Rafting on the San Juan and through the Grand Canyon. Canoeing the Green River through Canyon Lands NP the Bowron Lakes in British Columbia and many others.

We discovered a Tai Chi group meeting Saturdays on Shelter Island and met Nancy Floodberg there who invited us to the Point Loma Parkinson's Support Group. Shortly thereafter, Rock Steady Boxing/Downtown formed and we joined. In 2018, we participated in the Power over Parkinson's Camino walk to Santiago, Spain led by Sherrie Gould, NP Scripps. We have walked the Parkinson's Association annual fundraiser, Step-by-Step 5K, at Liberty Station every year since 2011. Last year we finished dead last, but Leila did every step of the way!

Over the years, Leila has encountered many of the effects of Parkinson's, taken many falls, and fractured many bones. Nancy has advised and smoothed the way with Orthopaedists. Family has unstintingly supported with care and respite – some by Zoom. Leila died in November 2023 still with indomitable spirit – We miss her. We appreciate and thank the support and dedication from family, the Parkinson's community in San Diego, the Parkinson's Association, the Parkinson's Foundation, MJF, and Davis Phinney Foundation and others.
